Annual Adopt-A-Family Day: Today there is a basket containing slips of paper near the exit from the Worship Service. On each slip of paper there will be a person, couple, or family identified. These are the people who were served most recently at two motels, and at Grove, through our Homeless and Hungry Ministry, supported by the Mission Dedicated Fund. At the last serving at the two motels, over one-third of the 91 meals went to school-aged children. KOG serves over 1100 meals per year through the H&H Ministry.

During this season of Thanksgiving, individuals and families of the KOG congregation are encouraged to take a slip of paper from the basket and keep these individuals—those who we serve have little or nothing to be thankful for, in the way of food, clothing, and opportunities to better their lives—in mind during family prayers. Pray they are given opportunities to improve their situation, and the determination to succeed. May they feel God’s love through our efforts to serve hot meals.

There is also a basket on the table for those who may want to give an offering in support of this Outreach Ministry.

Family Advent Worship Service Wednesday, 12/3 6:30PM



We invite you to experience comfort and joy in an innovative Advent worship series designed especially for families. Services will include family conversation starters and special songs presented by our school children. Each service in the 3-part series focuses on a selected portion of Isaiah 40 that captures one of three specific aspects of the comfort Christ comes to bring, which are peace, pardon and presence. Service 1 (Peace of Christ) is based around Isaiah 40:1-2 and highlights for us that true peace comes only through Jesus Christ and the forgiveness that he brings. He is our one and only Prince of Peace.

COMMEMORATION

Clement of Rome, Pastor
November 23rd

Very little is known of the life of Clement, sometimes considered the third successor of Peter as leader of the church at Rome. Irenaeus reports that Clement “had seen and consorted with the blessed apostles, but there is not proof of this. He is famous for the letter he sent as head of the church at Rome to the church at Corinth when some Corinthian Christians were in revolt against the leaders of their church. The letter is a model of pastoral concern and was well received by the Corinthians, read in their religious meetings for many years. On the strength of this letter, Clement is counted as first of the Apostolic Fathers. According to tradition he died a martyr’s death.
