THE WORD

Message Prayer: When God says, 'Wait?' The Rev. Kent Meads

Luke 18.1-8

¹And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart.

²He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man.

³And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' ⁴For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.'"

⁶And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. ⁷ And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? ⁸I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" **(ESV)**

(The Message)

¹Jesus told them a story showing that it was necessary for them to **pray consistently** and never quit.

²⁻³He said, "There was once a **judge** in some city who never gave God a thought and cared nothing for people.

A **widow** in that city kept after him: 'My rights are being violated. Protect me!'

4-5"He never gave her the time of day. But after this went on and on he said to himself, 'I care nothing what God thinks, even less what people think. But because this widow won't quit badgering me, I'd better do something and see that she gets justice—otherwise I'm going to end up beaten blackand-blue by her pounding."

6-8 Then **the Master** said, "Do you hear what that judge, corrupt as he is, is saying? So what makes you think God won't step in and work justice for his chosen people, who **continue to cry out for help?** Won't he stick up for them? I assure you, he will. He will not drag his feet. But how much of that kind of **persistent faith** will the Son of Man find on the earth when he returns?"

Jesus's Purpose (v.1)

In the parable Jesus is teaching us that in hard or difficult circumstance the faithful hang on to God.

And the way, we hang on to God, is by persistence and faithfulness in the practice of prayer.

The Parable (vv. 2-5)

1. The Judge (v.2)

A root issue is "shame" in v.2 not "respect" or "cared" the translation in the bulletin.

The word means "to make some ashamed." (Bailey)

Bribery is obviously the only way to influence such a heartless person.

2. The widow (v.3)

She is a typical symbol of the innocent, the powerless oppressed.

Her persistent behavior, "she kept after him," is connected to her continual cry, 'My rights are being violated. Protect me!'

3. The Judge's soliloguy (vv. 4-5)

The Arabic translation is "lest she give me a headache!" (Bailey)

The widow's perseverance conquers his shameless behavior.

Jesus's and the Parable's Purpose (vv. 1, 6-8)

Vv. 1 and 6-8 act as a parenthesis around the parable.

If the widow's needs are met, **how much more** the Jesus's disciples and our who pray not to a harsh judge but to a loving Father?

God stands in contrast to the judge.

Jesus raises a question: "how much of that kind of **persistent faith** will the Son of Man find on the earth when he returns?" (v.8)

What we hear, in the question is 'when **persevering prayer** disappears, so does **faith**.

I'll give you examples:

- 1. Luther
- 2. Calvin
- 3. Jesus

Why do we need to prayer persistently? A personal experience.
